Subject: New Laws and Information

New Law:

Chapter 197, Statutes of 2014, effective January 1, 2015, requires the addition of the following specific disclaimer to the top of the form certificates of acknowledgement, proof of execution and jurat: "A notary public or other officer completing this certificate verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which this certificate is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of that document." The statutory changes are as follows:

 California Civil Code section 1189 requires the disclaimer to be legible and requires the disclaimer to be in an enclosed box at the top of the certificate above the venue statement in the following format:

A notary public or other officer completing this certificate verifies only the identity of the individual who signed the document to which this certificate is attached, and not the truthfulness, accuracy, or validity of that document.

In addition, Chapter 913, Statutes of 2014, effective January 1, 2015, restores the conduct violation and penalty for a willful violation of California Government Code section 8214.1(d) setting the penalty for such violation at up to fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500).

Section 8214.15 of the California Government Code now provides in relevant part:

"(a) In addition to any commissioning or disciplinary sanction, a violation of subdivision (f), (i), (/), (m), or (p) of Section 8214.1, or a willful violation of subdivision (d) of Section 8214.1, is punishable by a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500)."
